DEC gives approval for Frontier Stone quarry in Shelby

SHELBY — The town of Shelby may have stopped a quarry company's aim to construct a stone pit near the Iroquois National Wildlife Refuge, but the state has approved the project and the company has filed an Article 78 challenging the way the town has done business.

The quarry project proposed by Frontier Stone in Shelby appeared to be in jeopardy when the Shelby Town Board passed Local Law No. 3 of 2017 creating a Wildlife Refuge Protection

Overlay District. The district adds extra regulations to the zoning map including stopping "improper development."

However, on Oct. 3, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) issued a Final Environmental Impact Statement for the proposed Frontier Stone quarry, which company representatives say will mean the DEC will issue Frontier Stone a mining permit to start blasting.

Frontier Stone proposed to construct a 215.5 acre dolomite/limestone quarry on a 269.45 parcel of land on the south side of Fletcher Chapel Road in Shelby, sending in an application to the DEC for a Mined Land Reclamation permit in March 2006. The quarry would produce highquality construction aggregate and high-grade agricultural lime.

According to Frontier Stone, mining — if approved — will be divided into four phases over the operational life of the mine, which is estimated to be 75 years.

"Quarrying would be conducted by standard drill and blast technology with front-end loaders and excavators feeding a primary crusher with shot rock. The primary crusher will follow the advancing face and rock would be conveyed to an on-site processing plant by field conveyor," the impact statement released by the DEC said.

Mining is proposed by Frontier Stone below the water table and the project includes dewatering the quarry area with a proposed maximum water withdrawal for mine dewatering at 554,264 gallons a day — which would be discharged at the southwest corner of the site into an existing agriculture drainage ditch. The reclamation objective will make an open space with two lakes -35.2 and 156.1 acres in size - for recreation and wildlife.

 ${\it Frontier Stone-along\ with\ plaintiffs\ Zelazny\ Family\ Enterprises\ LLC,\ James\ J.\ Zelazny,\ Robert}$ Kwandrans and David Krug — filed the Article 78 in the New York State Supreme Court on Tuesday and served the town on Wednesday.

Earlier this month, attorney Dan Spitzer, representing the town of Shelby, told the Daily News changes in the local law were not made to target Frontier Stone.

"Mining has been illegal in this town for some time," Spitzer said. "To change that you need rezoning. Nothing in this law changes that. You may need additional rezoning, but if the town board is in favor, they can get a rezoning. This is about protecting the refuge over a breath of the whole area north of the refuge."
